AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CITY OF HANCOCK PURCHASING ORDINANCE NO. 193

THE CITY OF HANCOCK ORDAINS:

The City of Hancock does hereby amend purchasing Ordinance No. 193 as follows. Section 1. Amend Section 2, sub section 2.

Encumbrance of funds

- A. Increase the amount from \$2,000 to \$6,000 without prior council approval
- B. Increase the amount from \$2,000 to \$10,000 range that shall require prior council approval to \$6,000 to \$20,000.
- C. Increase the amount that written bids are required from \$10,000 to \$20,000.
- D. Increase the emergency purchases from \$2,000 to \$10,000.

Section 2.

Add the following new section number 12.

Bidding or open market purchase is not required when purchasing professional services such as legal, architecture, engineering, and accounting, utility purchases such as electric and natural gas, insurance services, election services, or utilizing federal or state procurement services when these agencies already have bid out the product or products and have offered these products and prices to the City of Hancock.

Section 3. Invalidity

If any part of this ordinance shall be held invalid, such part shall be deemed severable and the invalidity thereof shall not affect the remaining parts of the ordinance.
