CITY OF HANCOCK PLANNING COMMISSION MINUTES OF OCTOBER 24, 2011

The regular October 24, 2011 Planning Commission meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Chairperson Dan Lorenzetti at City Hall with the following members present: Dan Lorenzetti, Bill Baxandall, Tony Wilmers, Glenn Anderson, Terry Monson, Lisa McKenzie, and Bill Laitila.

Absent: Dave Lucchesi and Bob Wenc

Guests: Roland Burgan and John Haeussler

It was moved by Baxandall and seconded by Wilmers to approve the agenda.

It was moved by Laitila and seconded by McKenzie to approve the September 26, 2011 minutes.

AYES: All NAYES: None Motion Carried.

There was no public comments.

Updates/Information

- -Reviewed the September 7th Portage Lake Lift Bridge Long Term Outage Committee meeting notes.
- -Reviewed the September 8the US41/M26 Corridor meeting notes.
- -Heard that the new 5.07 mile 16" water transmission main from Painesdale to the Houghton valve house is now operational, at a cost of \$2.38 million.
- -There is about \$700,000 worth of water distribution work under contract for 2012 and another \$500,000 of work still to be added.
- -Heard that about \$100,000 is left to spend on the sewer project for 2012.
- -Noted that since the sewer project started, the city has seen flow improvements for 6 months in a row.
- -Heard that Payne & Dolan had paved about 900 lineal feet of Navy Street from Sunset Dr./Forest St. East at a cost of \$27,000.
- -The city crew replaced a damaged section of storm sewer on Navy St. near the Medical Care Facility.

- -Heard that Mike Lahti has purchased the fire damaged building located at 116 Quincy Street from tax foreclosure with Houghton County, and plans on investing \$600 to \$700,000 to reconstruct 8 new apartments and keep the 1st floor commercial.
- -Heard the city is planning to apply for a \$320,000 MSHDA rental rehab conversion grant for the 116 Quincy St. reconstruct project.
- -Learned that the DEQ gave the city a satisfactory rating on its water supply system.
- -Noted that the city campground had a good year, just short of last year's usage.
- -Heard that the Quincy Mine had a 7.2% reduction of visits from 2010.
- -Heard that Finlandia University is planning to install new pole banners from City Hall to the Jutila Building.
- -Heard that MDOT has funded WUPPDR with a \$25,000 study grant to complete a final Portage Lake Lift Bridge Long Term Outage Plan, and the study is expected to be completed in September 2012.
- -Heard that the owners of the fire damaged house at 1310 W. Quincy St. were reviewing their options, rebuild or tear down and fill the site. A final decision is expected soon.
- -Reviewed the new SmartZone brochure.
- -Heard the 2012 Heikinpaiva is scheduled for the last week in January, with the annual parade held on Saturday, January 28th.
- -Heard the new 8 bay garage being built behind 424 Hancock St. is well under construction, with 3 sides done in original sandstone, and looks very nice.
- -Heard that Keweenaw Mining Company, with an office in Calumet, was looking at old drill core samples in the area for copper & other metals.
- -Noted that Finlandia University accomplished about \$1 million is cost reductions, including closing the pool.

Chairperson Lorenzetti asked the remaining 2 subcommittees, McKenzie & Laitila with Transportation, Recreation, & Cultural Facilities, and McKenzie & Wenc, with Tourism, Civic Design & Community Relations if the could complete these assignments for the December 5th meeting. They agreed to try.

Chairperson Lorenzetti said it's his goal to have a draft ready for the January 23rd meeting, and a final 5 year strategic plan done by the February 27th meeting.
