agreement with keweenaw community foundation

Moved by Councilor Hodur and seconded by Councilor Belej approving an agreement with the Keweenaw Community Foundation to establish the City of Hancock Parks and Recreation Expansion Fund with start-up money of \$10,000 (budgeted) from the General Fund and authorize Mayor McKenzie to execute the document as follows:

Agreement Establishing the City of Hancock Parks and Recreation Expansion Fund of the Keweenaw Community Foundation

This agreement is made on October 15, 2014 by and between the City of Hancock, Michigan municipal corporation (the "Founding Contributor"), and the Keweenaw Community Foundation (the "Foundation"), a Michigan non-profit corporation.

Whereas the Founding Contributor desires to establish and the Foundation is willing to hold and administer a charitable special project fund to be known as the City of Hancock Parks and Recreation Expansion Fund (the "Fund"), it is hereby agreed as follows:

1. Funding Type: The special project fund created by this gift will be held and administered by the Foundation in accordance with the following provisions, and will be identified by the Foundation as such in all relevant literature, reports, promotional material or other public documents.

- 2. Fund Property. The Fund will include the establishing cash transfer from the City of Hancock in the amount of \$10,000.00, together with any gifts which may later be delivered to the Foundation by any person, business, or organization (Contributors) when specified to be included in the Fund and accepted by the Foundation.
- 3. Purpose of the Fund. The Fund will be used to improve, replace, expand or acquire park or recreation facilities within the City of Hancock.
- 4. Investment of the Fund. Because of the specific and short-term requirements of the Fund, it will be conservatively invested in a Money Market account. In lieu of the Foundation's customary administrative fee for funds of this type, any interest earned on the assets will be retained by the Foundation.
- 5. Distribution from the Fund. Disbursements from the Fund may be made for specified purposes upon the written request of an authorized representative of the City of Hancock. Final responsibility for approval of disbursements from the Fund shall rest with the City of Hancock.
- 6. Governance of the Fund. The Fund will be governed and invested by the Foundation and will be deemed a separate trust fund held by it in a trustee capacity.
- 7. Commingling of the Fund. The property of the Fund may be commingled with the property of other component funds held by the Foundation, provided, however, that the separate identity of the Fund will be maintained and that disbursements from the Fund will be clearly identified as such.
- 8. Continuity of the Fund. In the event the City of Hancock Parks and Recreation expansion Fund ceases to exist, the Foundation shall transfer the assets constituting the Fund to the City of Hancock.
- 9. Dissolution of the Foundation. Should the Foundation be dissolved, or cease to exist as a 501(c)(3) organization, the assets of the Fund shall be transferred to the Community Foundation of the Upper Peninsula (CFUP) for administration under the terms of this agreement.
