- FOIA request for all City employee wages and we have provided the information. The information will be published on different website.
- MDOT billing thru February over \$200,000 normally over \$300,000. It is expense base billing for all expenses incurred to maintain US41 & M203.
- Cynthia Cote's outdoor art work will be on display for the JUHANUS day. The celebration of the 100th Anniversary of Finland will be in Hancock on Saturday, June 24th
- Pipetek's submitted the work authorization paperwork for the 3 employees' that were discussed at the last meeting.
- The Beachview Trailer Court is for sale, it is licensed for 19 sites. If it was going to be repurposed there would have to be an eviction process followed for current residents.
- Union agreement for the PLWSA 5 employees will have a .70 per hour raise. New hires are exempt from union pension system.
- Fire at 1510 Anthony Street, the building will most likely have to be torn down. The Hancock Fire Department along with other agencies in the area were on site.
- Houghton County Arena will have a new roof, compressor and painting. There is a grant
 for bleacher improvement. Possibility of Houghton County Commissioner's working on
 the City to become the owner.
- White Street will be closed for 30 days for water main construction.
- Front Street construction will start next week.
