- FEMA projects are reviewed by local representative and then sent to the CRC for cost review. We are also eligible for a 5% administrative cost reimbursement.
- FHWA Montezuma project awarded to Bacco Construction. Phase 1 Campus Drive bid opening is December 13th. The SIP loan program is the most logical way to pay the 20% for the FHWA projects.
- Rental Assistance Demonstration (RAD) concept for public housing authorities. This concept would convert the Hancock Housing Commission to a private non-profit section 8 housing.
- Beach Dock is substantially completed by MJO. There are 12 items that will be completed in the spring.
- The Hancock Public School sinking fund will be levied on the December tax bill.
- The final DNR passport grant application score is 180 up from the original score of 135.
- FEMA Section 404 and 406 Mitigation programs are separate funds. Our projects list includes some mitigation on projects.
- MISAIL 3 aerial imagery was completed recently, it was previously done in 1996.
- DNR Trail Navy St. temporary repairs were completed by DPW
- Campground had record activity for 2018.
- Beach dock DNR MNRTF 2 grant reimbursement were submitted.
- Storm water lawsuits and Bolt decision
- PH Foundation donated \$2,000 for the new ski trail machine.
- Welcome Arroyo Networks to E ½ of Gartner's Center, 100 Quincy St.
- There is a proposed electric rate increase of 9.71% which needs to be approved by MPSC, if approved it would be effective July 2019.
- Lead & copper rule changes/challenges
- 90% of the storm and 85% sanitary has been identified in GIS, which is funded by the SAW Grant.
